Schools provide students with **free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum** and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education, support, and infrastructure for our students.

We want to thank you for all your support, whether that is through voluntary financial contributions, fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Within our school your financial support has allowed us a wider offering of subjects and special curriculum experiences, enhanced digital learning opportunities.

Upgrades across the 2023 school year include:

- The continued upgrade of classrooms with replacement tables, chairs, and carpet
- Replacement of Internal and external LED lights across the school
- Updated CCTV cameras and supported software
- Laying of Instant turf and landscape works at the front of the school and B block.
- Undercover walkways and accessibility across the school.

In 2024 we will be focusing our attention on:

- the planning for science room upgrades and re-imagining existing classrooms to create spaces for the STEAM program (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics program).
- Increasing the Sun protected areas across the school for learning spaces and play.
- Introducing a concentrated cyclical maintenance program across the school to paint and update rooms, and corridor areas.
- Extending the landscaping projects across the other areas of the school.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
